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# Schools & Libraries Cybersecurity Pilot Program Overview

#### **Pilot Program Overview**

- The FCC established the three-year Schools & Libraries
   Cybersecurity Pilot Program to provide up to \$200 million in
   Universal Service Fund (USF) support to participating eligible
   schools, libraries, and consortia of schools and libraries to defray
   the costs of eligible cybersecurity services and equipment
- The Pilot Program will evaluate the effectiveness of using USF funding to support cybersecurity services and equipment to protect school and library broadband networks and data

#### **Pilot Program Eligibility**

- Schools, libraries, and consortia of schools and libraries that are eligible for support under the <u>E-Rate program</u> can participate in the Pilot Program
- Prior or current E-Rate participation is not a requirement to be eligible to apply for the Pilot Program

#### **Pilot Program Eligibility**

- Participants may seek reimbursement for a wide variety of cybersecurity services and equipment, subject to per-student/perlibrary budgets
- Four general categories of eligible services and equipment:
  - Advanced/next generation firewalls;
  - Endpoint protection;
  - Identity protection and authentication; and
  - Monitoring, detection and response
- The <u>Pilot Eligible Services List</u> (P-ESL) contains a non-exhaustive list of the types of services and equipment that are eligible

#### **Pilot Program Overview**

- The Pilot Program cycle is separate from the E-Rate funding cycle.
   Eligible applicants can participate in both programs
- Selected schools, libraries and consortia are expected to participate for the full three-year term of the Pilot Program
  - New participants will not be added in the second and third years
- Pilot Program funding is available for eligible equipment and services; it cannot be used for staff or other labor costs

# Pilot Program: Budget Limits & Spending Rules

#### Pilot Program: Three-Year Budget Limits (Schools)

- Schools and School Districts (S&SDs):
  - \$45,000 pre-discount for S&SDs with up to 1,100 students
  - \$40.80 pre-discount per student for S&SDs with between 1,101 and 110,294 students (\$13.60 pre-discount per student annually)
  - \$4.5 million pre-discount for S&SDs with more than 110,294 students

#### Pilot Program: Three-Year Budget Limits (Libraries)

- Libraries and Library Systems:
  - \$45,000 pre-discount for an individual library/site that is not part of a library system
  - \$45,000 pre-discount per library/site for library systems with fewer than
     12 libraries/sites
  - \$525,000 pre-discount for library systems with 12 or more libraries/sites

#### **Pilot Program: Budget Overview**

- Participating schools, libraries, and consortia determine Pilot Program discount rate based on the <u>E-Rate Category One discount rate</u>.
- Participants will pay non-discounted portion of cybersecurity services and equipment.
- Participants can use state, federal, or Tribal funding for non-discounted portion of costs.
  - May not use Pilot Program funds for services and equipment funded through other sources.

#### **Pilot Program: Spending Rules**

- Pilot Program expenses can be reimbursed as expenses are incurred.
   Participants may:
  - Spend their entire three-year commitment funding amount in the first year
  - Spend a portion of their budget in the first year of the Pilot Program, then spend the remaining in years two and three
  - Spend their budget evenly each year of the Pilot Program
- Pilot Program participants can NOT be reimbursed for expenses incurred prior to the start of the Program.

### Pilot Program: Get Started as an Applicant

#### **Pilot Program: Program Registration for Applicants**

- Obtain or confirm registrations are up to date:
  - FCC Registration Number
  - USAC Billed Entity Number
  - SAM.gov registration
- Set up E-Rate Productivity Center (EPC) access:
  - Call the E-Rate Customer Support Center at (888) 203-8100 (Monday-Friday, 8 a.m. to 8 p.m. ET)

#### **Pilot Program: Confirm Your Eligibility**

- Confirm your organization is eligible to participate
  - FCC Red Light Status
  - U.S. Treasury Do Not Pay List
- Entities on FCC Red Light Status when application window opens will not be eligible to participate in the Pilot Program

#### Pilot Program: Get Started as a Service Provider

#### Pilot Program: Service Providers' Role

- Service providers' Pilot Program role begins when applicants issue competitive bidding requests (Pilot Program FCC Form 470)
- Service providers cannot apply for the Pilot Program on behalf of a school or library

#### Pilot Program: Getting Started as a Service Provider

- Obtain or confirm registrations are up to date:
  - FCC Registration Number
  - SAM.gov registration
- Complete <u>FCC Form 498</u> to receive a 498 ID/SPIN

### Pilot Program: Consultant Limits

#### **Pilot Program: Consultant Limits**

- Due to sensitive information collected in the Pilot Program, EPC will limit consultant access
- Limit of 3 designated consultants per EPC applicant account
- Applicants must select consultants and grant access in Pilot Program participant portal
- Consultants listed in Administrative Account profile will be transferred to Pilot Program portal
- Requirements are unique to the Pilot Program and do not affect the E-Rate user experience

# Pilot Program: Applicant and Participant Processes

#### **Pilot Program Application Process**

Interested applicants complete FCC Form 484 – Part 1 during filing window

FCC selects pilot participants
Pilot participants announced in a public notice

Selected participants complete FCC Form 484 – Part 2

#### **Pilot Program Participant Process**

Competitive bidding (Pilot Program FCC Form 470)

Participants must wait at least 28 days for competitive bidding process

Request eligible equipment and services (Pilot Program FCC Form 471)
Receive Funding Commitment Decision Letter (FCDL) approving or denying request

Start services or delivery of equipment Submit request for reimbursement (SPI or BEAR method)

#### **Pilot Program: Get Ready**

- The Pilot Program application process (FCC Form 484) will open this fall
- Begin evaluating your school or library's cybersecurity needs:
  - Set goals and objectives for participation
  - Identify risks the Pilot Program can help address
  - Determine cybersecurity experience and expertise
  - Identify designated cybersecurity officer or senior staff member
  - Catalogue services and equipment to be purchased
